



Notice of Study Completion, Cove Pump Station No. 4 Improvements Municipal Class Environmental Assessment

The Study

The Township of Tiny ("Township") has completed a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA) that considered improvements to the Castle Cove Pump Station No. 4, located at 947 Concession 19 West, Tiny. The Township identified a need to consider improvements to the Castle Cove Pumping Station due to the limited space available within the existing pump station building to complete regular operation and maintenance activities, and in accordance with the Township's Health and Safety initiatives and water system improvement plans.

The preferred alternative solution is to decommission the existing pump station building and construct a larger replacement building at an alternative municipally owned location.



The Process

This study was carried out in accordance with the requirements of a Schedule B undertaking as outlined in the Municipal Engineers Association Municipal Class Environmental Assessment document (2000, as amended in 2007 and 2011). A Notice of Study Commencement inviting public input was first published on April 3 and April 10, 2014. A Notice for a Public Open House was published on September 10, 2015. The Open House was held on September 23, 2015 to describe the project and alternative solutions and to gather and respond to public comments as well as identify next steps in the process.

Project File Report

The Project File Report (PFR) has been prepared to document the planning and decision making process undertaken for this study. By this notice, the PFR is being placed on the public record for a 30-day review period starting March 24 2016 and ending April 25 2016 in accordance with the requirements of the Municipal Class EA process.
