#### **Position Summary / Main Purpose**

The Skating Instructor is responsible for the delivery of Tiny's "Learn to Skate" and "Skating Basics" Programs. This position teaches basic skating skills to children 3 to 12. The Skating Instructor must work very well with primary ages and must have strong interpersonal skills to communicate with parents and guardians.

### Key Duties and Responsibilities

#### 1. Class Instruction (80%)

- a. Delivers "Learn to Skate" and "Skating Basics" by following lesson plan guidelines, adapting teaching and delivery methods as necessary.
- b. Provides safe, inclusive, and meaningful instruction to children.
- c. Ensures that appropriate equipment is in place and ready to use prior to each lesson and that materials are safely stored away after use.
- d. Presents professional attitude at all times and maintains a high standard of customer service.
- e. Arrives to each lesson in appropriate uniform, with a copy of the Program Manual, First Aid Kit, and Attendance Sheet.

#### 2. Lesson Planning (15%)

- a. Attends all staff training and in-services as required, in order to be trained in the "Learn to Skate" and "Skating Basics" Programs, and all ice rink policies and procedures as required by the Township.
- b. Plans and develops interactive lessons based on knowledge of theory and practical techniques of skating.

#### 3. Record Keeping (5%)

- a. Reports all incidents, questions, and concerns to the Community Recreation Coordinator in a timely manner.
- b. Responsible for recording attendance and creating a progress note for participants at the end of the program.
- 4. Required to work in compliance with the Ontario Health and Safety Act and regulations and all related Township policies and procedures.
- 5. Perform other related duties, as assigned, that are in accordance with job responsibilities and/or necessary departmental or corporate objectives.

#### Physical and Mental Demands

#### **Physical Environment:**

• Classes take place outdoors, in cold and extreme weather conditions.

#### **Physical Effort:**

- Skating for a minimum of 45 minutes at one time
- Ability to walk, stand for 45 minutes at one time

#### **Sensory Demands:**

- Overhead lights at the rinks, with some loud noise due to number of individuals on the ice.
- Visual concentration is required to be aware of surrounding and work environment for safety reasons.
- Auditory concentration is required to listen to feedback from the participants.

#### Mental Demand (Stress):

 Moderate level of stress when interacting with children/youth and providing instruction to various ability levels.

#### Outcomes of Error

- The employee is directly responsible for the consequences of error up to the point of check or review, and must be able to work without supervision.
- Implications of error could include loss of goodwill, physical harm to residents, and loss of resource (i.e. damage to equipment).

## **Working Conditions**

- Classes are scheduled to run Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday evenings across all Township of Tiny outdoor rinks, with the potential for Saturday morning classes.
- "Learn to Skate" and "Skating Basics" classes are scheduled to begin on Tuesday, January 13, 2026 and will run for 5 weeks.

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- Up to 9 hours of work per week, depending on ice conditions.
- Instructors are expected to work with minimal supervision.
