#### Video Idealization

A lot of songs today are released as music videos, which have aspects that change the outlook of society's minds. These videos are often idealized, which affect how we look at our relationships. Idealization in music is shown through videos depicting the world through a select representation of society, often featuring those who are considered 'beautiful'. The effect of idealization can give listeners the negative feelings of envy, jealousy and even depression. #### Tones of Music

#### Does recycling really make a difference?

Recycling helps make a difference to the environment by reducing pollution. According to Laurie Brenner from Sciencing; when companies use recycled items, they help decrease air and water pollution by a great amount. For example, using recycled paper, the air pollution is cut down by 73% and water pollution by 35%. While companies and factories are excavating natural resources to create more articles for their businesses, they are causing water and air pollution by emitting many harmful chemicals like burning fossil fuels into the atmosphere. With the help of recycling, companies can reuse these materials, using less energy and burning less fuels that contribute a great deal to world pollution.

Recycling helps make a difference to the environment by reducing the contamination on landfills. For example, Drew Brucker from Rubicon indicated that around 80% of trash that is sent to landfills could be recycled. That means that much materials could be saved and repurposed instead of polluting and harming the environment. Reusing many of these recycled products permits for much less waste to be brought to landfills.

Recycling also helps make a difference to the environment by conserving more natural resources. A website named Recycling to Live Green stated that, materials such as water, wood and minerals are natural resources that can be conserved from recycling because they can all be repurposed. For example, 4,100 kilowatts of energy, 2 barrels of oil and 17 trees can all be saved with every ton of paper that is recycled. If recycling were not a strategy, companies would be forced to extract more natural resources, leading to a very unhealthy and bare environment. Reusing these items that still have repurposes to them, allow for more desirable natural resources to stay stable.

Recycling helps reduce pollution by using less factory energy through repurposing materials, allowing less harmful gases to be released into the atmosphere.
