Municipal Law Enforcement Update June 17 to 19, 2022

Date: June 23, 2022

(Tiny, Ontario) Over the period of June 17 to 19, 2022, the Township of Tiny By-law Officers were on full patrol responding to calls ranging from noise enforcement, illegal parking, and failure to obtain a burn permit.

Offence Type	Charge(s)
Cawaja Beach Parks By-law - Permit animals on the beach between 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. (June 15 - September 15).	1
Burning Enforcement – Fail to obtain a burn permit.	1
Noise Enforcement – cause or permit a noise from any electronic device or other sound-producing equipment.	1

As a result, Township By-law Officers patrolled a total of 386 km via bike patrol and responded to 49 complaints. By-law Officers issued 30 parking tickets for illegally parked vehicles. For current parking regulations visit the Township’s website at www.tiny.ca/parking.
