

A site plan identifies buildings and structures in relation to property boundaries and other features.

A site plan is required to be submitted with every building permit application as per Township Building By-law 22-030.

The following information must be shown on a site plan:

- Title and scale
- Street name(s)
- North arrow
- Property lines with dimensions
- All existing and proposed structures including the sewage system with dimensions and well location (if applicable)
- Setbacks (distance) to all property lines and sewage system from all existing and proposed structures
- Lot coverage of existing and proposed structures
- Rights-of-way and easements
- Any creek, drainage, water courses or steep slopes



NOTES:

- 1. Do not submit this sample site plan as part of any building permit / drawing on Cloudpermit.
- 2. Any site plan showing proposed structures must match building drawings.
- 3. Site plan must be provided to scale.
- 4. Ensure to differentiate between existing and proposed structures.
- 5. A survey or lot grading plan may be required for verification of information on site plan.
- 6. If your property is on the shoreline, a site plan is not acceptable. A survey prepared by an Ontario Land Surveyor to identify the property, existing / proposed structures and the 178 metre elevation (flood hazard limit of Georgian Bay) is required.
