Change Your Clocks, Change Your Batteries!

The Township of Tiny Fire and Emergency Services Department reminds the community to **change smoke and carbon monoxide (CO) alarm batteries** when changing clocks for daylight savings time on November 6. Smoke alarms are critically important for protecting your family's safety. Replacing batteries at least once a year or when the low battery warning sounds is essential and could be a life-saving change. Ontario law requires all homes to have working CO and smoke alarms. Carbon Monoxide (CO) Awareness Week

As part of **Carbon Monoxide Awareness Week**, happening November 1-7, the Township of Tiny Fire and Emergency Services Department is reminding residents about the risks of carbon monoxide and the important steps to take to avoid exposure in their homes. Carbon monoxide alarms are required in all Ontario homes that have a fuel-burning (wood, oil, natural gas, propane) appliance, fireplace or an attached garage. This includes appliances that produce carbon monoxide such as furnaces, water heaters, stoves, dryers, barbeques, portable heaters and generators. All fuel-burning appliances should be inspected regularly by a certified technician to check for leaks and ensure there is no build-up of carbon monoxide. Symptoms of exposure to carbon monoxide may be similar to the flu but without the elevated temperature. Known as the "silent killer," exposure to carbon monoxide can cause headaches, nausea, dizziness, breathlessness, collapse, loss of consciousness and death.

New Tiny Zoning By-law

On October 12, Council approved the new **Tiny Zoning By-law 22-075**. Until the appeal period for the new By-law is over on November 16, 2022, and once any appeals have been disposed of, both new Zoning By-law 22-075 and the previous Zoning By-law 06-001 as amended will be deemed in force and effect for the review of all planning and building applications and the most restrictive regulation shall apply. The Zoning By-law is the Township's primary tool to regulate the use of land in the municipality. Residents are encouraged to review the approved Tiny Zoning By-law on the Township's website.

Seasonal Reminders

As a **reminder** to the community, the Township of Tiny is located in an area that may be exposed to large quantities of snow accumulation. The Township would like to remind residents that **winter weather** can change quickly and unexpectedly and the conditions of the road will reflect this change in weather, so please be sure to drive accordingly. **Snow removal** is performed on a schedule required to meet the provincial road maintenance standards based on road classification. This means that roads with higher speed limits and traffic counts take priority (higher class roads). This will also affect the time of day to which your road is plowed. It is important to make sure that no obstacles are within reach of the plow area. This includes the removal of garbage boxes and recycling bins. Please be sure to place these items far enough back onto your property to avoid damage. Please visit the County of Simcoe for proper placement of bins and garbage containers during winter months. Please be sure that children stay clear of roadsides such as ditches and ends of driveways. During the winter months, parking on the road is strictly prohibited at all times as it interferes with **snow removal** practises.



Jackson Park Boat Launch Seasonal Closure

Please be advised that the **Jackson Park Boat Launch** will be closing for the winter season, effective Monday, October 24, 2022. As part of the closure, the dock will be removed and no further maintenance will occur at the boat launch for the winter season.


Winter Road Closures on Concession 8, 15 and 17 West

The hills located on **Concessions 8, 15, and 17 West**, Hall Road and Stamp Sideroad will be closed for the winter months, as there is no winter maintenance on these sections of roads. The closures will commence on Tuesday, November 1, 2022, and remain in effect until further notice.
