(Tiny, Ontario) Over the period of August 22 to 24, Township of Tiny By-law Officers were on full patrol responding to calls ranging from noise, short-term rentals, and signs.

Fireworks Prohibited

With the upcoming Labour Day long weekend approaching, the Township of Tiny would like to remind the community that [Fireworks By-law 07-054](#), prohibits the display of and setting off of fireworks outside of Victoria Day, Canada Day, New Year's Eve, and New Year's Day. Therefore, the discharge of fireworks is strictly prohibited within the municipality outside of these four days. Concerns regarding non-compliance and specific details of the address where the violation is occurring can be reported to the Municipal Law Enforcement Department at

705-526-4204. Non-compliance may result in the issuance of a warning, a charge with fines ranging from \$365.00 to \$100,000.00, or a summons to appear in court.

Noise Control By-law

The Township of Tiny would like to remind the community that [Noise Control By-law #21-028](#), Section 3.1 states: “No person shall emit or cause or permit the emission of noise resulting from activity listed in Schedule “A” if clearly audible at a point of reception.” The following are two examples of complaints commonly reported to the municipality:

- The operation of any electronic device or group of connected electronic devices incorporating one or more loudspeakers or other electromechanical transducers, and intended for the production, reproduction, or amplification of sound;
- Persistent barking, calling or whining or other similar persistent noise made by any domestic pet or any other animal kept or used for any purpose other than agriculture.
