

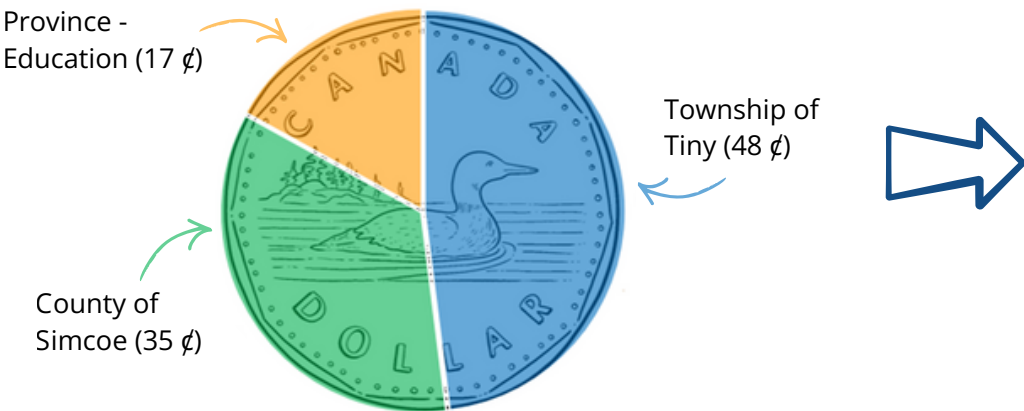
Where do your tax dollars go?

Based on the 2026 Budget



How are tax dollars allocated?

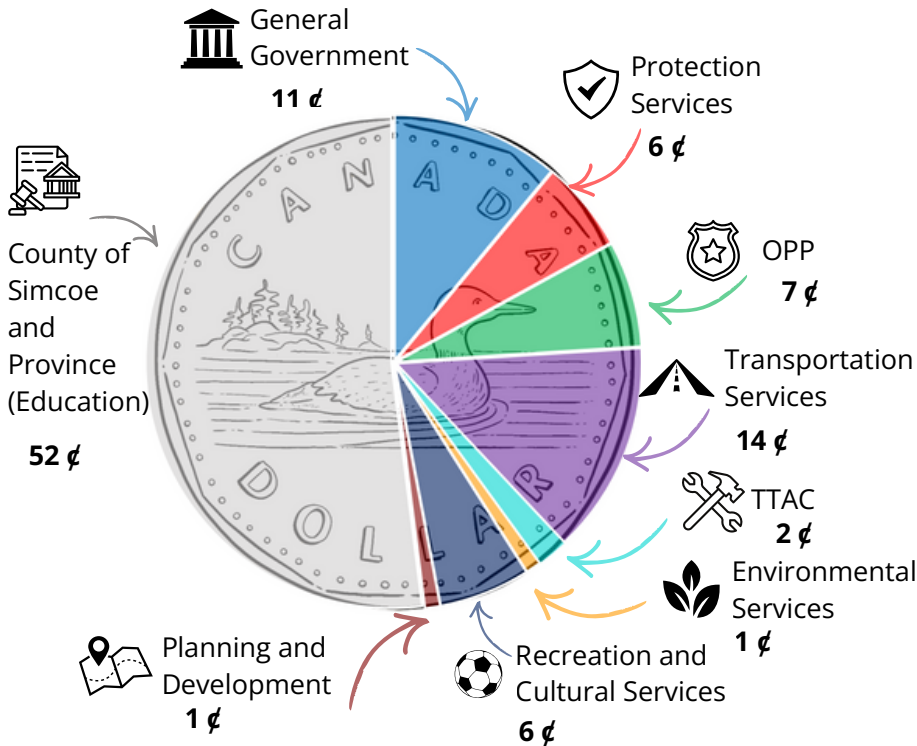
For every tax dollar collected, the Township of Tiny receives 48 cents, the County of Simcoe receives 35 cents, and the Province of Ontario (Education) receives 17 cents.



How much money goes toward township services out of the 48 cents per dollar?

Of the 48 cents per dollar that the Township of Tiny receives, the taxes are divided to support township services as follows:

- General Government: 11 cents
- Protection Services (By-law and Fire): 6 cents
- Ontario Provincial Police (OPP): 7 cents
- Transportation Services: 14 cents
- TTAC (debt financing): 2 cents
- Environmental Services: 1 cent
- Recreation and Cultural Services: 6 cents
- Planning and Development: 1 cent



What will my property taxes be?



Property taxes are calculated by using the blended tax rate which is made up of the municipal, county, and provincial (education) tax rates. The 2026 blended tax rate increase is 3.99 per cent. Property owners can use this blended rate to calculate their property tax increase by taking the total amount of taxes paid last year and multiplying by the blended tax rate increase per cent, provided your assessment value has not changed.

Total Taxes Example (Municipal, County, and Province - Education):

- A \$1,000 total tax bill (found by adding all taxes paid in 2025 together) multiplied by 3.99 per cent would be a total tax bill of \$1,039.90 in 2026.

How much money goes toward the Ontario Provincial Police (OPP)?



Of the 48 cents per dollar that the Township of Tiny receives, the OPP receives 7 cents from the township portion which is approximately 14 per cent of the township's budget. This means the remaining 41 cents supports a broad range of municipal services for our residents.

Residential Tax Bill Example

If your residential property was assessed at \$350,000 in 2025, and the 2026 blended tax rate increase is 3.99 per cent:

- + Municipal increase: \$73.37
- + OPP increase: \$11.95
- = Total municipal portion of the tax bill would increase: \$85.32

This would equal a **total monthly increase of \$7.11** in the municipal portion of your tax bill for 2026.
