Note: An "Occurrence" is when a Municipal Law Enforcement Officer responds to any complaint (whether it is determined that a by-law violation has occurred or not), or when doing pro-active enforcement and a violation of a by-law had occurred.

From 2025 to 2026 the number of complaints have decreased over the second quarter time period. Staff analyzed the differences and would draw the following conclusions:

Short-Term Rentals: Over the course of the second quarter, the By-law Department opened ten (10) complaints (8 reactive & 2 proactive complaints) related to eight (8) separate Short-Term Rental properties which is a decrease from 66 complaints in 2025, and further decrease from 194 complaints in 2024.

Court Activities during this quarter

On April 2, 2026, there were 14 property matters on the court docket and the following was their disposition:

Short-Term Rental By-law Violations- 14 properties, 28 defendants, (44 charge counts)

- Defendant appeared on their 1st court date in compliance with the by-law and entered a guilty plea on behalf of both defendants to advertise with no Licence. A fine of \$250.00 was imposed on each defendant with 6 months to pay (Total \$500).
- A legal representative, appeared and requested further disclosure. These matters were adjourned to June 4, 2026, at 10:30 a.m., for further disclosure.
- A legal representative, appeared and these matters were adjourned to June 4, 2026, at 2:30 p.m., for a judicial pre-trial.
- A defendant appeared in compliance by purchasing a 2026 Licence and entered a guilty plea to advertise no Licence. A fine of \$500.00 was imposed with 6 months to pay. The other two counts were withdrawn.

- A legal representative, appeared and entered a guilty plea to the offences of advertise without a Licence, fail to comply with and Order and operate without a Licence. A fine of \$1000.00 on each count was imposed with 1 year to pay (Total \$3,000).
- A legal representative, appeared and entered a guilty plea to the offences of advertise without a Licence, fail to comply with and Order and operate without a Licence. On May 27, 2026, there was 1 property matter on the court docket and the following was its disposition:

Short-Term Rental By-law Violations - 1 property, 1 defendant, (2 charge counts)

- The defendant appeared and these matters were withdrawn as a critical witness was not available to appear. Both the court and the defendant were notified prior to the count date that a Trial would not proceed.

On June 4, 2026, there were 18 property matters on the court docket and the following was their disposition:

- The defendant appeared on their 1st court day in compliance and entered a guilty plea to advertise no Licence. A fine of \$500.00 was imposed with 6 months to pay. The remaining count was withdrawn.
- A legal representative, appeared and plead guilty to advertise no Licence. A fine of \$750.00 was imposed with 6 months to pay. The other two counts were withdrawn.
- A defendant appeared on their 1st court day in compliance and enter a guilty plea to advertise no Licence. A fine of \$500.00 was imposed with 90 days to pay. A suspended sentence was given against the two other owners/defendants. The remaining counts were withdrawn.
- A defendant appeared and entered a guilty plea on behalf of both defendants to advertise no Licence. A fine of \$500.00 to each was imposed with 6 months to pay. The other three counts were withdrawn. (Total \$1,000)

- The defendants appeared and entered a guilty plea to advertise no Licence. A fine of \$250.00 each was imposed with 90 days to pay. The other two counts were withdrawn. (Total \$500)
- A legal representative appeared for the defendants. These matters were adjourned to August 13, 2026, at 10:30 a.m., to set a trial date.
- A legal representative appeared for the defendants. These matters were adjourned to August 13, 2026, at 1:30 p.m., to resolve or set a trial date.
- A legal representative appeared and entered a guilty plea to advertise no Licence. A fine of \$1,000.00 was imposed with 30 days to pay. The other counts were withdrawn.
- A legal representative appeared and requested that all matters be adjourned for a resolution/plea. These matters were adjourned to September 9, 2026, at 10:30 a.m., for an in-person appearance.
- A legal representative appeared and plead guilty to advertise no Licence. A fine of \$1,000.00 was imposed with 30 days to pay. The other three counts were withdrawn.
- A legal representative appeared and plead guilty to advertise no Licence. A fine of \$1,000.00 was imposed with 60 days to pay. The other two counts were withdrawn. These matter were resolved at pretrial.
- A legal representative appeared and plead guilty to advertise no Licence. A fine of \$1,000.00 was imposed with 90 days to pay. The other two counts were withdrawn. These matters were resolved at pretrial.
- A legal representative appeared and had themselves removed from the record. The defendant attended and these matters were adjourned to September 3, 2026, at 2:30 p.m., for pretrial continuation. The defendant is to appear by video or in person with or without Counsel. A Crown trial is to be conducted with new Counsel or the defendant prior to the next date.

Zoning By-law Violations - 2 properties, 4 defendants, (3 charge counts)

- The defendant appeared and requested disclosure. The defendant will be representing themselves in this matter. The matter was adjourned to September 21, 2026, at 9:00 a.m., to be spoken to.
- A defendant appeared and requested further adjournment. These matters were adjourned to August 13, 2026, at 1:30 p.m., to set a date for trial or to resolve.

Burning By-law Violations - 1 property, 2 defendants, (1 charge count)

- A legal representative appeared for the defendants. These matters were adjourned to August 13, 2026, at 10:30 a.m., to set a trial date.

The By-law Department has successfully prosecuted various Short-Term Rental matters through the court system during the 2nd quarter which has imposed \$24,000 in fines. Total fine since the Short-Term Rental By-law was passed and prosecuted \$43,635.

The cost is \$30.00 per calendar year, plus a 5 per cent processing fee for online transactions (from the township's payment service provider). A fire permit may be purchased online with a credit card at: www.tiny.ca/firepermit. The fine for failing to obtain a fire permit is \$365.00, or a Summons to appear in court.

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Noise Control By-law

The Township of Tiny would like to remind the community that Noise Control By-law #21-028, Section 3.1 states: “No person shall emit or cause or permit the emission of noise resulting from activity listed in Schedule “A” if clearly audible at a point of reception.” The following are two examples of complaints commonly reported to the municipality:

- The operation of any electronic device or group of connected electronic devices incorporating one or more loudspeakers or other electromechanical transducers, and intended for the production, reproduction, or amplification of sound;
- Persistent barking, calling or whining or other similar persistent noise made by any domestic pet or any other animal kept or used for any purpose other than agriculture.

Items remaining after 72 hours may be picked up by Township of Tiny staff, disposed of, and a Non-Compliant Waste Service Fee of \$180 will be applied.

Fireworks Permitted only on Canada Day!

With the upcoming Canada Day Holiday approaching, the Township of Tiny would like to remind the community that Fireworks By-law 07-054, prohibits the display of and setting off of fireworks outside of Victoria Day, Canada Day, New Year's Eve, and New Year's Day. Therefore, the discharge of fireworks is strictly prohibited within the municipality outside of these four days.

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Concerns regarding non-compliance and specific details of the address where the violation is occurring can be reported to the Municipal Law Enforcement Department at 705-526-4204. Non-compliance may result in the issuance of a warning, a charge with fines ranging from \$365.00 to \$100,000.00, or a summons to appear in court

Parking Control By-law:

The Township of Tiny would like to remind the community that parking restrictions supports road safety, traffic flow, accessibility, emergency vehicle access and assists the Township in managing its maintenance standards. Parking Control By-law 20-015, as amended, stipulates a number of parking restrictions within the Township of Tiny. If the vehicle has not been removed within three (3) hours of the first ticket being issued, the vehicle will receive a second parking ticket. Additionally, Officers are legally authorized to order the towing of vehicles, at any point, that are violating the Parking By-law, at any time at the owner's expense. The below list includes some of the most common violations. No person shall park a vehicle on a highway:

- where signs regarding Disabled Parking have been erected and are on display - \$300 Fine;
- or parking area where parking is prohibited - \$90 Fine;
- where signs regarding Tow-Away Zones have been erected and are on display - \$90 Fine;
- where signs regarding Fire Access Routes have been erected and are on display - \$90 Fine;
- in a Permit Parking Zone without a Parking Permit - \$90 Fine.

Parking rates are \$3.13 per hour, with a minimum \$6.25 purchase and a \$25.00 per day maximum fee. Pay and Display parking machines accept payments by coins and credit card. Personal items left on municipal property will be labelled with a yellow warning tag and must be removed within seven calendar days. Where a tagged item is not removed within seven calendar days, the municipality will remove the items and store them at a municipal facility to allow property owners to recover their items. If the items at the municipal facility are not claimed by the owner within 30 days, the items will be disposed of.
